## Relevance and replicability of housing cooperatives' role in the provision of affordable housing

Worldwide governments are rolling back from the housing sector, the private sector is proving unable to cater for the needs of low-income groups, and an increasing number of people across the world are struggling to find a decent home.

In this global context, people are seeking new strategies to meet their housing needs, and housing cooperatives are regaining international attention as a third way to secure access to affordable noncommodifiable housing.

This one-day international conference brings together a group of leading experts on cooperative housing. Drawing on their international experiences and insights, it will explore the current role, approaches and strategies of housing cooperatives in a selected number of countries. Speakers and the audience will openly debate the opportunities and challenges of replicating successful practices in different contexts.

Drawing on the various international examples of cooperative housing the conference will unpack the following questions:

- What is the role of housing cooperatives in the provision of non-commodifiable housing and inclusive cities? What context-specific factors enable or constrain their housing projects?
- What are the opportunities to scale-up and to transfer successful cooperative housing practices in different socio-economic, cultural and institutional contexts?
- How can housing cooperatives and their partners share experience across national boundaries? Which approaches work and what are their achievements?
